

BSA Space

BSA Space, home to the Boston chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA), serves as a center for architecture and design, one of several in the United States.

Founded in 1867, the Boston Society of Architects (BSA) is one of the oldest and largest chapters of the AIA, the professional architects' association, a nonprofit membership organization dedicated to architecture, design and the built environment.





Program - The 16,000 sq. ft. BSA Space on two floors of Atlantic Wharf is located in the former Graphic Arts Building of 1897. The Atlantic Wharf complex, designed by CBT architects as a LEED Platinum building, hails as Boston's first *green* skyscraper with a total of 1,200,000 sq. ft. The BSA hosts a range of events including educational, corporate, institutional and private gatherings of up to BSA Space can accommodate up to 300 participants. Offices for staff, breakout rooms, multiple galleries and a roof terrace provide a distinctive environment conducive to engaging community and professional exchange, close to the Harborwalk, Fort Point Channel and the Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy Greenway.



Activity Hub

BSA Space is an important center for architecture and design by facilitating the networking, communication and dialogue for architects, designers, related professions and the public through its exhibitions and programs.

In partnerhip with the Rose Kennedy Greenway the BSA organizes Design Biennial Boston, a series of temporary, site-specific architectural installations in the parcels adjacent to the BSA Space.
